

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

A Reflection – While we Wait

We believers know about waiting; indeed the Prophet Isaiah (chap. 40) speaks eloquently about those who wait upon the Lord and what they can expectantly receive. We Christians wait with great expectation for the Lord's return – the Parousia as we describe it, when the Risen and Ascended Lord does return. While we wait then, what should we be doing? We have a clue albeit from the interaction the Risen Lord had with his disciples. After he offered His peace, He breathe on them and told them to go and witness to the world. The instruction is the same for us believers, for there is much witnessing to be done. Right here at SMAA, we have to seek out those with whom we shared fellowship before COVID, those we no longer see, when we gather for worship. Let us not wait for them to return, rather let us seek them out. Whilst we wait, let also seek to offer hope to those who are daily discouraged by their personal circumstances. Some could use our prayers while others would welcome a call from us. Whilst we wait, we can respond to the appeal issued by the vestry for food items or donations to be shared with those who are in need like the homeless community. Charlie Clark, who is our regional representative on Diocesan Council, says that at a recent meeting (April 15th) the call went out for parishes to prepare for the summer when school age children will be at home with the possibility of them going hungry! Food assistance that was previously provided is being significantly reduced for a multitude of reasons. Back to SMAA, while we wait on Bishop Howard to summon the Diocese to Convention, we have to go ahead and do what we must here in our parish.

Yes, while we wait, let us do what we are able to – give of our time, talent, and treasure so that God's will could be done among us.
