## Mother's Day Celebration around the World

Mother's Day is celebrated all around the world so as to express respect, honor, and love towards mothers. This is a unique day to honor the contribution of mothers, acknowledge the efforts of maternal bonds and role of mothers in our society. Mother's Day observance was created by Anna Reeves Jarvis in 1908 and became an official United States holiday in 1914. Jarvis would later denounce the holiday's commercialization and spent the latter part of her life trying to remove it from the calendar. Traditionally, Mother's Day involves presenting moms with flowers, cards, taking her to dinner, and other gestures of generosity.

The celebration of mothers and motherhood can be traced back to the ancient Greeks and Romans, who held festivals in honor of the mother goddess Rhea and Cybele. The early Christian festival was known as "Mothering Sunday." The celebration fell on the fourth Sunday in Lent and was originally seen as a time when the faithful would return to their "mother church"- the main church in the vicinity of their home for a special service.

Motherhood in Africa is taken very seriously, and mothers are very revered and considered to be a central part in the family and in the child's life. Most women in many parts of Africa desire to be mothers more than almost anything else in life. In Pygmy culture, after having a child the mother and father lift the baby towards the sky and pray: "To Thee, the Creator, to Thee, the Powerful, I offer this fresh bud, new fruit of the ancient tree. Thou art the Master, we Children. To Thee, the Powerful God, I offer this plant."

So to Mothers everywhere, we say Happy Mother's Day.
