FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

THE DOCTRINE OF THE HOLY TRINITY

This central dogma of Christian theology says that the one God exists in three Persons and substance, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The God who reveals Himself to mankind, is one God equally in three distinct modes of existence, yet remains one through all eternity. The word Trinity was first used in its Greek form by Theophilus of Antioch (AD 180) but is not found in Scripture. However, our church theologians point out that this doctrine is to be found in biblical narratives such as in the story of the appearance of the three men who appeared to Abraham (Gen. 18), which foreshadowed the threefold nature of God. In the New Testament the most influential text is the reference to the three Persons in the baptismal formula at the end of Matthew's gospel (28:19). Other passages make reference to the trinitarian formula such as Paul's benediction in 2 Corinthians 13:14.

Finding the appropriate concepts to explain this doctrine was not easy and many 2nd and 3rd century Christians adopted views that were later considered unorthodox. It was not until the Councils of Nicaea (325) and Constantinople (381) that this doctrine was defined in its simplest outline i.e. that the Persons differ only in origin, meaning that the Father is "ingenerated", the Son is "generated" by the Father and the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father. Simply put, God is creator, the Son is the redeemer, and the Holy Spirit is the Sustainer. Again three Persons but one God.

In other words the God who created the universe in all its beauty and majesty, is the same God who came to us in the Person of Jesus the Son, and it is the same God who did send forth His Spirit at Pentecost.
