Becoming like little Children

I saw something simple yet truly remarkable last Sunday when Al and Delores Lawson's granddaughter Harlem and Verona Satchell's grandson, Roland interacted. They both brought their toys to church. I watched them wave at each other, and just started walking towards each other! I have no idea what caused them to react the way they did—they exchanged gifts and then proceeded to engage in some small talk. What Jesus says in his gospel about becoming like little children? Amazing is it not, how readily children make friends of total strangers and without hesitation, share what they have? They know nothing of the prejudice that beleaguers our relationships. Recently Genevieve brought to my attention a story that has been making the rounds on the internet. It has to do with two little boys, one white and the other black. The white youngster went home and told his mother that he wanted to dress just like his brother. He has no brother, so the mother wondered at his assertion—only to find that this supposed brother, was African American! As she discovered, it was pointless arguing with him, for his class friend was his brother as far as he was concerned! She finally conceded and hopefully, was taught an important lesson by her son—a lesson we all could well learn as our nation becomes even more polarized and certainly divided along racial and political lines.
