

### FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

### I Remember Leslie

Leslie Baker passed from time to eternity on Sunday (June 11<sup>th</sup>) evening at a facility here in the City, and it was my privilege to be at her bedside as she transitioned. Leslie was strong willed and always uncompromising in what she believed ought to be done. She was undoubtedly one of those special individuals who graced the SMAA landscape. As Maya reminded me, Leslie looked back with great pride on the day when they were both confirmed here at SMAA by Bishop Samuel Johnson Howard, thereby offering them both the opportunity for full membership among us. When I joined the parish back in 2017, Leslie took me aside and explained the essential role the Hospitality Committee played in parish life. Quite obviously serving as chair of that committee offered Leslie the opportunity to serve her God and King. Only when she became too ill to serve anymore that she decided to walk away. To date, no one has offered to take her place despite Leslie's personal recommendations. Leslie loved her family, but adored Maya—she believed in her heart that Maya was a special gift from God, and she literally poured all that she did have into Maya. I still remember how delighted she was when the 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary accepted my recommendation that Maya be the guest speaker for that historic celebration. She called me back twice to thank me for bestowing such an honor on Maya. Leslie loved SMAA and spared no effort in supporting this church. I still remember her gift when we decided to fundraise for the Capital Campaign. Indeed, Leslie will always have a special place in the hearts of all of us who loved her for what she demonstrated as a Michaelite. May she Rest in Peace and Rise in Glory. Fr. Hugh+

### **Historical Reminder**

Juneteenth (short for June Nineteenth), marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth honors the end of slavery in the United States and is considered the longest running African American holiday. Confederate General Robert E. Lee had surrendered at Appomattox Court House two months earlier in Virginia, but slavery had remained relatively unaffected in Texas until U.S. General Gordon Granger stood on Texas soil and read the following:

"The people of Texas are informed that in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free."
