FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

A Truly Painful Loss

In recent times, so many families have been plunged into grief, because of the loss of a loved one. We had to console Maya when Leslie left us, and this week Marie, as she and her family lost Rodney Roberts to heaven. Do pray for Marie, as she and her family try to come to terms with their loss. Before I say anything further, let me re-introduce Skylar Warren, one of the interns who joined our ministry team recently, setting in motion our long awaited effort at establishing a campus ministry. I still remember her infectious personality as she shared with the vestry the vision of what such a ministry could look like in actuality. It is truly amazing how social media is being utilized these days to promote emerging ideas, particular those targeting the younger demographic among us. This is precisely what Skylar did for us last month-having us dream of what was possible for our Campus Ministry. Yesterday (Thursday) Kimberly Douglas informed me that Skylar had lost her mom. Apparently, they both had traveled to New Orleans to enjoy the Essence Festival that has become something of a pilgrimage for lots of families. As Skylar indicated on her Facebook page, this was the first "mother/daughter" trip they had undertaken. We could well imagine how proud her mom would have been seeing her daughter serve as a panelist for one of the many discussion groups the festival offered. All of that was short lived, as her aunt (Pamela Porter) explained, Tiffani-fell ill and had to be rushed to a nearby hospital. Unfortunately, she slipped into cardiac arrest and subsequently passed.

Skylar has since returned to New Jersey to complete the funeral arrangements for her mom. There is a particular verse found in the Book of Common Prayer (1928) which reminds us that "in the midst of life, we are in death". Skylar's loss is reminiscent of the painful truth that statement so unequivocally makes plain. Finally, Skylar was still in a state of shock when I spoke with her later in the day. Like the rest of her family, she is still trying to make sense of what just happened.
