

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Christian and Politics

The challenge facing every genuine, altruistic, self-conscious, and God-fearing disciple of Christ is how to balance the dialectic between obedience to God and obedience to the State. Are each mutually exclusive, or is the Christian to be both or a devoted disciple of their faith and a political pundit in the fight for social justice and equality for all. Here in America we have an opportunity and responsibility as citizens to participate in our government since Christians are called by God to be salt to the earth and light to the world (Matt. 5.13-16). Now, though it is without question that Christians have an opportunity as citizens to participate in the affairs of government, is it also true that Christians are called by Scripture to proactively participate in government? Our government here in America gives citizens the freedom to participate in governmental affairs if one chooses to, while at the same time God does mandate the believer to participate in the political process. However, I do struggle with the notion of how does a born-again believer live out in her/his daily living the teachings of Matt. 5.13-16, where you must be the salt of the earth and light of the world, do good deeds, and shine before humanity without plowing and particularizing your political muscle?

I know historically, America has been a nation long on praise, but short on performance. The American promise engrained in the Declaration of Independence is probably the most humane ever reduced to language: "We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness." Now, the promise stored within those words is theologically correct and anthropologically sound. The democratic ethos, representing the ideal with respect to the historic social experiment is rooted in religious realism and grounded in the Christian doctrine of man. Reinhold Niebuhr's famous epigram states it well: "Man's capacity for justice makes democracy possible, but man's inclination to injustice makes democracy necessary."

Today, we Americans must be honest with ourselves that the democratic ideal has yet to become a reality in the lives of ALL her citizens (Blacks, Hispanics, Gays, Lesbians, Transgender, and Native Americans). Irrespective of constitutional guarantees, congressional acts, presidential pronouncements, and denominational proclamations, America still must be viewed through the lenses of microscopic realism rather than the lenses of telescopic idealism.
