FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Christian and Politics (continued from last week)

From my reading of the Scriptures, I am firmly convinced with most theologians and Bible scholars that "the Scriptures advocate neither total withdrawal from the political process nor over investment in it." The Gospel applies to all of life, and the Bible instructs the believer about government and political authority. The challenge/question facing every born-again believer of the LORD Jesus (the) Christ is how to actively engage the political process faithfully and apply Christian principles appropriately. James Davison Hunter, in his book, To Change the World: The Irony, Tragedy, & Possibility of Christianity in the Late Modern World, gives four suggestive practical helps for how political engagement should look:

- Political engagement trumps participation
- Political engagement is costly
- Political engagement should be kind
- Political engagement should only be engaged by kingdom citizens doing kingdom politics (this is where the participating Christian calls out what is evil and unjust with prophetic boldness)

In conclusion, the modern church catholic should always be reminded and reflect upon the apostle Peter's epistle he sent from Rome to the Christians in five provinces of Asia Minor as part of the generic vocation of God's royal priesthood, the church, is to "conduct herself honestly among the Gentiles" (2.12), to submit to human authority" (2.13), to "do good" (2.15), to "honor everyone" (2.17), and to "be like-minded and sympathetic, love one another, and be compassionate and humble, not paying back evil for evil or insult for insult. But on the contrary, giving a blessing since you were called for this" (3.8-9). The church must always remind herself that the New Testament speaks exhaustively about how she is to conduct herself in all spheres of life, including politics.
