# What Does It Mean To Live By Faith?—The Rev. James Vaughn

As born again, baptized in the Holy Spirit and water, saved, sanctified, and sanitized from the world by the blood of Christ Jesus, do modern latter-day saints really know what it means to live by faith? For each and every disciple of Christ Jesus, is living by faith a fact of life or a fiction from a lullaby? Is living by faith a discipline or a destination? Is living by faith your stalwart strength or your Saturday night special that makes you look like a winner rather than a warrior? I must admit that too many modern-day disciples of Christ live as victims rather than as victors all because they really do not know what it means to live by faith. Perhaps the late godfather of soul, James Brown, epitomized the modern-day contours of so many disciples of Christ's faith when he sang, "Just talking loud and saying nothing." I am convinced beyond a shadow of a doubt that you are living by faith every day, regardless of what happens, you have been inoculated by the penicillin of the Holy Spirit to possess a radically quiet confidence that God is good, He is in control, He knows what is best for you, and He does answer all prayers on His own timing. The apostle Paul made this point unequivocally when he said in Romans 8.28, God is working all things together for the good of those who love Him.

Therefore, the challenge of every born-again believer is to stop complaining about what is wrong with the world, why is there so much pain and suffering in the presence of a just and juridical Jesus, and take a moment to reflect upon the meaning and message of each alphabet in the word faith. My mother taught me, as I began to live by and mature in my walk with the LORD, I begin to obey the command of each letter in the word: forwarding all issues to heaven. Meaning, our God, in spite of local and global tragedies and misfortunes, He is still good, He is still at work in the world, He is still in charge, He is still in control of His cosmos, and His work is so good at all times.

For me, living by faith has taught me several salient points about what it means to live by faith. In Mark 9.14-32, the evangelist shares with the reader Jesus' healing a boy possessed with an evil spirit. The key verse of the pericope is what Jesus says to His trainees in v. 23: *"Everything is possible for him/her who believes."* I want you to notice what the father did not do- he did not say: "Maybe my son inherited this problem from me" or "perhaps if I had raised him differently." No, the father dumped the responsibility onto the disciples, who themselves were in training.
