

### What Does It Mean To Live By Faith?—The Rev. James Vaughn

Continued from last week

Do we not prefer to dump the blame of our trials and tribulations on the pastor, the church, our mate, our boss, our significant other, our family, our foes, our friends, our looks, our social status, or we seek to find some other excuse? Why are we unwilling or afraid to admit that we were at fault? After Jesus healed the boy, His disciples asked Him, "Why could we not drive it out?" (v. 28; Matt. 17.10). Is that not like asking, "Why is not my marriage not working?" Why am I still in debt?" "Why is my life not going as planned?" Jesus' reply to His neophyte disciples was, "Because your faith is too small" (Matt. 17.20). I believe your living by faith really makes you live and look weird, you care not for the community's approval, and it does not matter whether or not you fit in—the kind of faith that led Noah to say, "Even though there has never been rain and nobody in my generation believes, I am still going to do what God said." The call to and challenge facing every believer in the body of Christ is to live by faith as you stand on what God had told you in His Word, because in the end everything will come out according to God's Will, Work, Way for your life.

Living by faith means you are confident that God is in control of everything, good or bad. Living by faith means you constantly and continually recognize the sovereignty of God's control over everything. Living by faith means you are confident that God knows what is best, not because He is our Boss, but rather because He knows what is best! Finally, living by faith means you are confident that God answers prayer. When you pray let's begin to pray big and pray boldly. To live by faith is your being an example of your doing your trust and obedience to our LORD and Savior, Jesus (the) Christ. Our freedom and power in Christ Jesus goad our life to praise, honor, and give glory of our safety and solace in the protective, precious, providential, and prevenient arms of Christ Jesus.
