FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

A Catastrophe of Monumental Proportions

Continued from last week

In the heat of battle who thinks of such words. In the face of such brutality, the shooting of infants, teenagers, and the elderly with no mercy shown to the victims, explains why so many are being made to pay. In a single day some 700 persons were killed when their bomb shelter (a church) came under attack by the Israelis. Among the many who died that day, were Palestinian Christians— indeed some of the oldest enclaves of Christianity are to be found in that part of the world. And the tragedy continues in Gaza with hospitals unable to tend to the several wounded, doing surgeries by flashlight and desperately trying to keep alive babies just a few days old!

Of course this conflict has been on-going for a while, meaning that wars have broken out between the Israelis and Palestinians before. I still recall the famous seven days war when Golda Meir was Prime Minister of Israel. Actually it might be worth the while to remind ourselves about the true nature of this intractable war between these "sons of Abraham". The Palestinians have complained about the willful annexation of their lands and the on-going occupation of their territory by the Zionists. New settlers have just gone ahead and moved in after bulldozers were used to destroy homes, schools, and businesses alike. Indeed many have likened what has happened in the Palestinian homeland to a new form of apartheid! One only hopes that when the sound of battle finally ceases, a scenario will emerge in which Israelis and Palestinians finally see the two-state solution that so many have hoped, worked, and prayed for including several Presidents of our own United States.

End of an Era

Bishop Samuel Johnson Howard completed his 20 years of service to the Diocese of Florida on Tuesday of last week. A seamless transition ensured that the administration of the Diocese passed from Bishop Howard to the Standing Committee led by the Rev. Joe Gibbs, that has now become the Ecclesiastical Authority. We thank God for the leadership Bishop John provided particularly during the turbulent days of 2003 and beyond. The Rev. Anthony Fergurson (ret) did say to me that if he were +John, then I would not have met him, for he would have gone to Alaska!! We thank God that Bishop Howard stayed and wish him good health and a well-deserved retirement.
