A REFLECTION

Following Jesus By A Walk of Faith—The Rev. James Vaughn

If the truth be told about the Christian's walk with God, the vast majority of disciples of Jesus (the) Christ are walking by their feelings and not by their faith in God. You can vacillate from one end of life's spectrum to the other because your feelings change all the time. For example, you can begin the day with love and happiness and before you know it you have come to realize you are angry for whatever reason. But to live each day by faith in God means you live every day, no matter what the social situation is, the emotional evaporation, the psychological pleasantry, the political posturing, or the cultural contours that come your way, you have this quiet resolve and confidence that God is good, and He withholds nothing from you. Does walking and living by faith mean you do not prepare and plan for retirement? Does it mean you swim with alligators because you have faith God will protect you? Does it mean you should not undergo cancer treatment as proof you trust God as Healer?

The Bible says in II Corinthians 5 :7, *"For we walk by faith, not by sight."* This verse confirms once you chose to follow God, it means you are totally trusting Him to lead and love you in the right direction. It means you are taking the right and appropriate steps of faith, even when things do not make sense, and your world seems to be falling to pieces. The born-again believer in the body of Christ must always remain cognizant of the fact it is a natural inclination to walk behind the ways of the world as opposed to obeying God's Word, maintain your living according to His will, and saturate your focus on following daily the truth of and in the footsteps of Christ Jesus. When you program both your mind and manners to having an eternal perspective, you then can feel at home in both worlds (2 Cor. 5:6-8). Walking and placing your faith totally in God have everything to do with your being confident that your spirit does not fall victim to being easily evaporated over the elation of events (positive or negative) and turn out to be a mirage. Christian faith becomes more palpable and perfective as the believer places her/his confidence in the living LORD God.

The late Dr. Charles F. Stanley, Pastor Emeritus, First Baptist Church of Atlanta, Georgia said: "When the Bible tells us about a great man or woman of faith, the LORD in His kindness often also shows us the person's weakness and failings. For example, Abraham was exactly like so many modern-day believers because he had his faults, failures, and he sinned. He made mistakes, yet God loved him and accomplished so many monumental events throughout his life.
