

A REFLECTION

Following Jesus By A Walk of Faith—The Rev. James Vaughn

Continued from last week

When the LORD spoke to Abraham, he listened. Can you imagine the many promises and blessings he would have missed had he failed to pay attention? (Gen. 12.1-8; 15.1-5; 17.1-4). It was Abraham's many conversations with God that teaches the believer about the spiritual ingredients of what following and walking and talking and living by faith looks like. First, you must learn to Listen To God (James 1.19). When you recognize God's voice and His presence in your life, you will have the blessed assurance regarding what to do and where to go. Secondly, learn how to Trust and Obey (1 Peter 1.14). When you obey God, this shows God that you really trust Him, and once trust in God grows your, faith in Him becomes stronger. Thirdly, you must learn how to Depend On God (Deuteronomy 8.2-3). It is the desire of human beings to be self-sufficient, independent, and self-determining creatures of habit, but the Scriptures constantly remind you that you need God's wisdom, strength, and help. Fourthly, the germane discipline of the spirit facing every born-again believer is your learning how to Wait On God (Exodus 14.14; Psalm **37.14**). Too often the believer has become a victim of the current culture of having to have it right now rather than standing still and letting God move in His own time. This waiting wisdom will teach you how to reap marvelous blessings, thereby preventing you from making a mess of your life. Finally, in your walk of faith with God you must learn how to Acknowledge, Admit, and Learn from your failures (Matthew 23.18). The Scriptures are unequivocal and emphatic regarding how growing a discipline of humility is how God exalts the humble. It is via your failing that you sharpen your spiritual senses, reclaim your God-given resources, and build strong bridges to help you cross life's turbulent and tempestuous waters.

Now, my question to you is- which of the above do you struggle and wrestle with, and contemplate in your faith walk with the LORD? I am firmly convinced this is a sign, a signal, and a mile marker that you are growing, and God is trying to tell you something. In your daily prayer time and Bible reading, ask God to help you move faithfully forward, test you from time to time so as to grow your trust in Him, and listen with love only to His voice for directions. The hymnwriter, J. H. Sammis, a Presbyterian minister, wrote the hymn and tune to one of the great hymns of the church in 1887, where it says: "When we walk with the LORD in the light of His Word, What a glory He sheds on our way! While we do His good will, He abides with us still, And with all who trust and obey. Trust and obey for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."
