

By next Sunday we will begin a new liturgical/ecclesiastical year, as we observe the first Sunday of Advent. Advent Sunday is the first day of Advent and kept on the Sunday nearest to St. Andrew's Day (November 30th). Four Sundays in Advent normally precede Christmas Day—Advent was formally kept as the "little Lent" with less strictness. Festivities are still discouraged except for the Third Sunday when rose colored vestments are used instead of the traditional purple.
