FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Left Asking why?

The first word this Advent Season is Hope. Indeed we believers are people of Hope regardless of the setbacks, and the unfortunate circumstances that pervade our lives. Yet we are left asking very often, why? Some of us are still trying to understand why October 7th happened in Israel, when supposedly they have the best Intelligence Service in the world (Mossad). So how could HAMAS, a terrorist organization with limited resources and certainly not the military hardware that Israel has in its arsenal, breakthrough Israeli's defense and inflict such pain and suffering? Mind you HAMAS's leadership live daily with the fear of assassination at the hands of Israeli commandos. So how did they find the time to plot such a near perfect scheme which resulted in the deaths of some 1200 Israeli citizens and well over 250 persons kidnapped and taken to tunnels in Gaza. Why did that happen? We know why 14,000 plus Palestinians have died on account of the merciless bombings their homes and shelters were subjected to. For me the more fundamental question is, why this conflict that dates back to biblical times continues to persist, yes why have these sons of Abraham not found a way to live peacefully beside each other?

Surely like me, you have kept asking yourselves why bad things happen to good people—a deeply philosophical question, the answer to which eludes us all? Again the question surfaced for me when I heard that Dr. Bill Cody, who served the Jacksonville Community some years ago, was diagnosed with myelofibrosis (a rare form of leukemia). The Codys as a family have suffered much. Shortly after we got to Jacksonville, their daughter, a student at UF, was tragically murdered. Shortly thereafter the wife, Betty, contracted breast cancer all the while caring for Bill who by that time discovered that he had prostate cancer. Their son got married and the child he and his wife welcomed, was discovered to be suffering from leukemia. Thankfully he survived and is now leading a normal life. A few years ago, Betty complained of feeling unwell, and after she was taken to ER, it was found that she had a malignant tumor. As Betty will tell you, her life has been nothing short of tragic. When she was only a child, her parents' home was completely destroyed by fire and as fate would have, her mom subsequently died, leaving her to care for her two siblings. Betty must now care for Bill once more. Again I ask why this man who devoted his life to the care and nurture of many, now must face an uncertain future punctuated by anxiety, uncertainty, and sadness. Do pray for the Codys this week and especially for Bill.
