From Crisis to Compassion to Comfort!

The one thing I always remember is how my mother corporately chastised me, she was not abusive by no stretch of the imagination, but rather she was a strict disciplinarian. My mother believed that appropriately and adequately applying the board of education to the seat of the problem was her way of training and teaching me the truth and giving me wisdom about the importance of obedience. To this day, even though my mom recently transitioned to rest in that land where travelers are never known to return, I am eternally thankful to my mom for her punishing me as she deemed necessary.

As a student of the Old Testament and mental observer of Israel's behavior towards God, I am not convinced they learned from God's punishment of them, Did Israel not understand nor believe what Jehovah said in the Book Deuteronomy about behavior that brought blessings and behavior that brought a curse upon them? However, throughout their history I am convinced there were a few Israelites (called "the remnant") who did learn to trust and obey God.

The Old Testament lectionary text for this Second Sunday of Advent is one the most significant and soul-stirring texts reveling God's continuous love, yearning, and His passion for His disobedient children. The Isaiah 40.1-11 text is a joyful refrain that introduces this unexpected reversal of fortunes for Israel. Persia maintained colonial control over the peoples in the ancient near east, but people were allowed to live in their native lands as long as they remained loyal to the Persian government. Isaiah attributes this foreign policy to the workings of their God, Yahweh, who now chooses to change the status of the displaced Jews. The verses before us today opens the second part of the Book of Isaiah, which contains poems reflecting the impact of the Persian expansion under Cyrus the Great on the peoples living in exile after the Babylonian destruction of Jerusalem.
