FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Celebration of Christmas

All over the world today Christmas is being celebrated with special church services, traditional family gatherings (some folks have traveled to be with loved ones) and the exchange of gifts. I have commented before how the secular world has literally highjacked this sacred observance, this important promise being fulfilled when our God decided to come among us, and has completely commercialized this historic event. Indeed lots of us here in Tallahassee went straight from Thanksgiving right to Christmas! In our neighborhood, the decorative lights have just stayed on—perhaps our neighbors have wondered about us and why we did not put ours on! We did not, because we had to first observe Advent and prepare our hearts for the Christ to enter in us again.

Christmas is finally here, so let the celebrations begin for us Christians, as we ponder again the significance of the coming of the Christ Child and the explicit humility of His birth. It might interest you to know that great speculation existed about the date of our Lord's Nativity. For instance Clement of Alexandria had suggested in the 3rd century, May 20th! Indeed, it was not until the 4th century that December 25th was decided on—to oppose the observance of the Roman feast "Natalis Solis Invicti"—the birth of the Sun of Righteousness. Whatever the origin of the December 25th date, after the accession of the Roman Emperor Constantine, this practice of the celebration of our Lord's Nativity spread from Rome to the rest of the then known world. Also in earlier times, three masses were said at Christmas (at midnight), dawn and later in the day. Unbeknownst to many of us, the popular observance of this sacred feast (with lots of joy and merry making) was the Church's attempt to replace pagan festivals that held sway at that time. However in the 19th century, the Christmas celebration developed considerably in England with the importation of German customs (like Christmas trees). Of course the singing of carols became an important feature in both ecclesiastical and secular contexts, as we do today.
