

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Returning

The Old Testament prophet Hosea (Chap 6:1) issued a call to return, pleading with his people not to forget the goodness of the Lord. In Hosea's view, his people had all but abandoned the protectors of Israel in the face of what turned out to be illusionary prosperity, Hosea found it baffling how quickly his people seemed to forget that it was Yahweh who had kept them safe from their enemies, always. And now, inexplicably they were now seeking alliances with Egypt and Assyria! Hosea agonized over the breach of the terms of the covenant Israel had solemnly sworn to keep. Of course the people of Israel paid dearly for their apostasy.

Prophets and teachers in every age have felt the necessity to issue similar warnings when we believers have strayed from the source of our blessing. Beyond a shadow of a doubt, our nation is experiencing for the moment, a period of prosperity we haven't seen in awhile!
