Bring Three for Tally

That was the cry on Monday evening when member churches gathered at the Old West Florida Enrichment Center, 2344 Lake Bradford Road, 32310 for the Pep Rally. Seven of our parishioners represented SMAA, and we pledged to turn out 30 for Tally. Some 150 persons were in attendance as we laid plans for the Upcoming Nehemiah Action scheduled for April 16th. We listened to inspiring addresses and personal testimonies provided by individuals whose lives have been impacted by either gun violence or homelessness. At the Action we hope to hear from the City Commissioners, the Sheriff's Office and the TPD how they plan to respond to the out of control gun violence situation that threatens our City, the lack of affordable housing for large swaths of fellow citizens, and the Civil Citations program which is being offered to young people among us—this program has been successfully implemented in cities across our nation. So there is much to look forward to as we prepare for the Assembly. In the meantime, let us share with our families, friends, neighbors what CAJM is seeking to do as we work together to bring Justice to Tallahassee—put April 16th on your calendars!

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

THE LORD IS RISEN

A Happy and Holy Easter to one and all! Believers in the first century of the Christian Church greeted each other in this way-The Lord is Risen, the Lord is Risen indeed, Alleluia! It seemed so much easier for those who lived in the earliest days of Christianity to believe that Jesus rose from the dead. For us 21st century believers, we have a difficult time convincing skeptics about the resurrection, because Easter is more difficult to grasp apparently than Christmas. Why—because the birth of children is such a natural phenomenon but resurrection of the dead—not so much. Our problem in grasping this concept has been described in this way, "God's coming into our world connects with the human experience; man's going into God's world leaves human experience behind! Our culture is skeptical about the resurrection idea and some of us are tempted to leave it behind as we did of Santa Claus. Mind you there are those who have argued unconvincingly that science has "proved" that resurrection cannot happen. My simple question to that affirmation, is how? How many persons will we need to kill to just prove that experiment successful? In the first century, those who opposed Paul's teaching on the resurrection, simply said-dead men do not rise—what else you've got? Some scholars have helped by providing an explanation that says, "resurrection" means that Jesus "lived on" in the memory of his friends, and in their transmission of his teaching and example to others. Those who have accepted this view, only see the Christ as a great moral teacher, not a redeemer. This argument flies in the face of the "eyewitnesses", those who ate and drank with Jesus after He has risen from the dead. Certainly they could not have all been delusional! Then there is the record of the gospels and writings that would have appeared about 20 years after the crucifixion (possibly even earlier) that affirms that Jesus rose from the dead, and this belief became the core conviction of the entire Christian Community. Indeed, early church Christians disagreed vociferously about many things (see the Pauline Letters) but the resurrection was not one of them. To quote St. Paul, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain, you are still in your sins—then those who have died in Christ have done so in vain!" Actually there were too many living witnesses to the Christ event, who not only believed, but preached resurrection and were prepared to die for their faith.

Coming closer to our day, arguments for the resurrection are not just about what actually happened way-back-when, instead friends, they are about the meaning and purpose of human life, now. As one writer put it, "if there were no resurrection, then there is no justice for those who died unjustly, nor for the victims of mass shootings. If there were no resurrection, there is no justice; justice does not exist; there is no hope. But if there is resurrection, then there is justice even for the dead; and if there is justice for the dead, then there is justice for all; then none of what we do in the cause of right and holy, is ever in vain."
