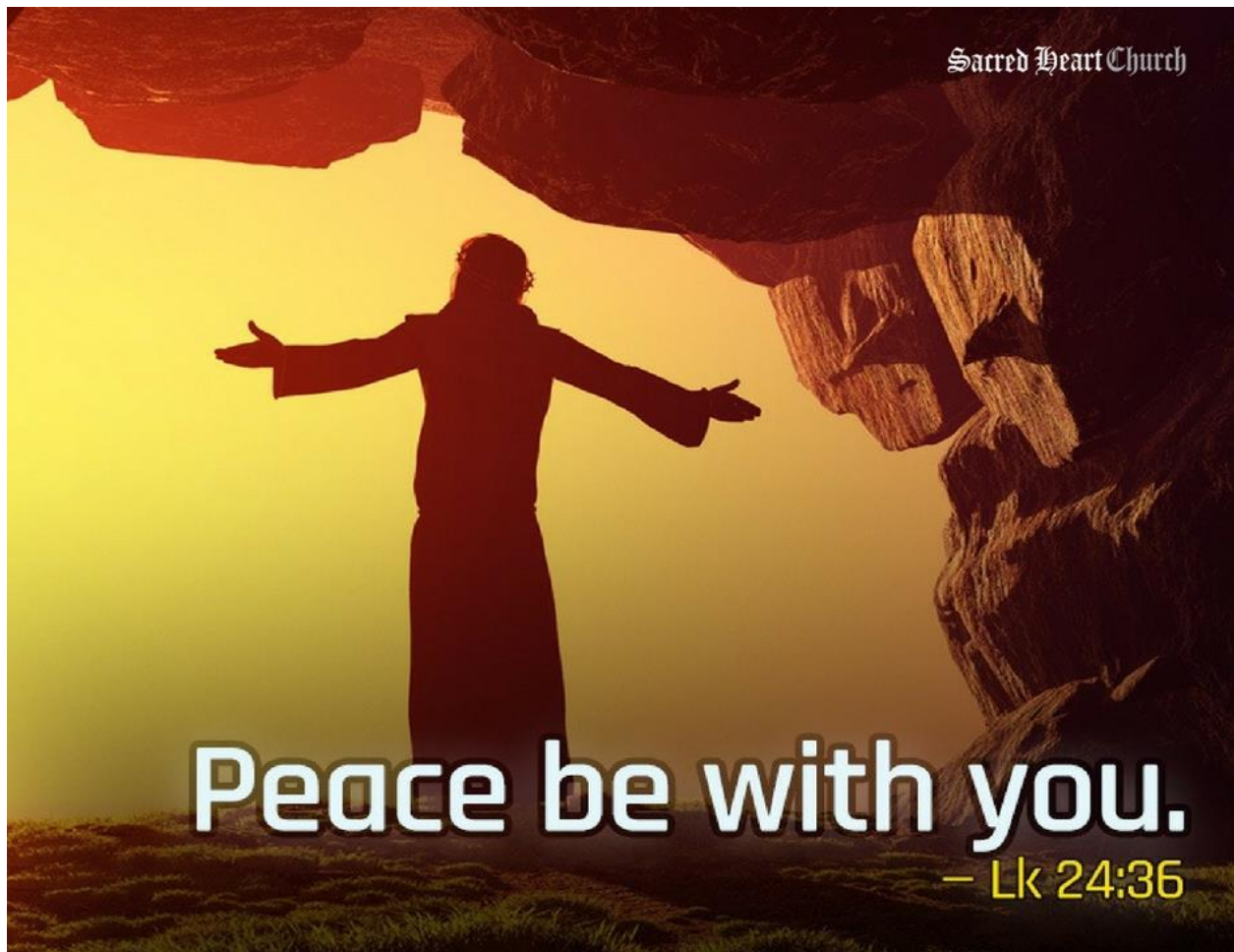

“Koinonia”
(1 John 1.1-2.2)

All three lectionary texts (John 20.19-31; Acts 4.32-35; 1 John 1.1-2.2) lessons testify to the power, the potency, and the proficiency residing in the fervent fellowship of all believers. The New Testament word for this type of community common life I am referring to is known as “Koinonia”. The root word is koin, meaning “common” or “that which is held together.” The text before us reports of the community’s witnessing to the Resurrection for the sole purpose of sharing in fellowship with the Father, the Son, and other believers (v. 3). The lesson from the Book of Acts of the Holy Spirit (not Apostles) describes the community in Jerusalem as a closely-knit fellowship. In the gospel lesson from John 20.19-31, the risen LORD appears to His ten trainees in a type of fellowship of suffering. They were all mourning the death and demise of their LORD and Master. But oh, how Christ Jesus showed up with His death garments still on that third day and provided a transformation trajectory that changed the community of suffering and shame into a community of grace and life.

As I look at, internally and externally, the life, living, and behavior of the church catholic, I really do have to ask do we (the born-again church of God in Christ) really believe that the Resurrection is real, reformative, and responsive? Whether you want to believe it or not, according to the redemptive story that began at a prohibited tree in Eden and ended on a provided tree at Calvary is the glue/the hallmark of our relationship with one another. Life in our LORD and Savior is not about assets and access, but rather our allegiance to fellow members in the family of faith. Not toys, but rather our trust in Him who truly lives. Not money, but rather the mercies of God towards us. Not degrees of letters, but rather devotion of love and living. Not live at the Apollo of performance, but rather living in order to make life a better place. Not worship where you are whipped up in the mixing bowl of contrived emotionalism, but rather your being showered and sanitized by His Hagios Pneuma to leave the Temple and return to the vineyard equipped to evangelize anybody whom you can lead to tell somebody about a Man from Galilee who save anybody.
