#### **RECTOR'S DESK**

The traditional Mothers' Day observance, allows us for a few moments to focus on mothers, grandmothers and mother figures in our churches, community, and country. Interestingly enough, this celebration is attributed to a secular and social movement that emerged in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries here in these United States and other countries as well. It is indeed the one day we set aside to honor, thank, and pamper our mothers and grandmothers, in particular. Our friends in the business community relish the month of May, for "Mother's Day" certainly helps to boost their bottom line. This is particularly true for restaurants and those who produce greeting cards, floral arrangements, and special gift items. So yes, it is something of a bonanza for entrepreneurs. A look back in history always helps however and as we do so, we see where the celebration of mothers and motherhood actually originated with the ancient Greeks (Roman society) where festivals were held in honor of the goddesses Rhea and Cybele. Closer to our day, the Mother's Day celebration can be traced back to the early Christian festival known as "Mothering Sunday." It was once a major tradition in the United Kingdom and certain parts of Europe, and it was always observed on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent, when faithful worshippers returned to the "mother church" i.e the main church in the vicinity of their homes for a special service. Over time, however, the Mothering Sunday tradition became more and more of a secular holiday with children presenting their mothers with flowers and other tokens of appreciation. This custom however faded and gave way to the American Mothers' Day celebration in the 1930's and 1940's.

So look what this observance has evolved into? I thank God for mothers everywhere and especially those who are living in war zones, those who must still feed their infants in the face of famine, and those who must protect their little ones from all forms of exploitation. We salute you all today.
