

"Seven Minutes of Terror"

John 11.38-43/Hebrews 4.16) Rev. James C. Vaughn Jr.

The above topic has been taken from the scene of the 18 February 2021 Mars rover space landing, Perseverance. The news media reported that the NASA guided landing as "seven minutes of terror" because being 292 million miles away from earth, the communication signals from Mars to Earth takes several minutes. The complex landing and NASA not being in immediate contact with Perseverance was frightening for the team, who had put so much effort and resources into the mission.

Well, sometimes we have and will experience those moments of fear and frustration when we feel we are not hearing from God- we pray, but we do not receive an answer. My paternal grandmother, the late Mtr. Laura Duhart-Vaughn (with her Ph.D. in wisdom) told me something very early in my conversion experience: "James Jr, my child, it will do you well to learn how to hear God, even when He is saying nothing." Though I did not understand Momma Laura's wisdom then, I must admit it was a much-valued deposit into my spiritual bank account years later. We must always remain cognizant of the fact when you pray to God, you do not provide Him with information about your situation, but rather to receive inspiration from Him for your soul.

Nowhere in the sacred canon, from Genesis to Revelation are we told God will always answer your every prayer when you pray and respond to your every beacon call. Your challenge is to know God will answer your prayer on His schedule, and your assignment is to learn how to trust and obey Him. I do know in Scripture, like Daniel 9.20-23, God immediately responded thru the angel, Gabriel to Daniel's prayer for his sins and Israel's sins. It was a long time before Hannah (I Samuel 1.10-20) received an answer to her prayer for a son. Her rivals were poking at her and accusing her of being drunk from beer and wine. Hannah became so despondent over God not answering her prayer she even stopped eating. Listen to v. 20: "So in the course of time Hannah became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She names him, Samuel, saying 'because I asked the LORD for him'." Then, perhaps the most poignant scene of a delayed answer to prayer was Mary and Martha's (who sent word to Jesus about their brother, Lazarus' sickness in John 11). Listen to what Jesus said in vv. 14-15: "Jesus said unto them plainly, Lazarus is dead. And I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, to the intent you may believe; nevertheless, let us go unto him." Four days after they prayed and sent word to Jesus about their brother, where Jesus waited until four days later before responding. But four days later, Jesus answered the sisters by Resurrecting their brother (vv. 43-44). As difficult, dismaying, and draining it can be waiting for Christ Jesus to answer your prayer, I beg you to always remain steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the Word of the LORD.
