

"Seven Minutes of Terror"

John 11.38-43/Hebrews 4.16)

Continued from last week.

This text from Hebrews 4.16 is the answer, the comfort, and consolation to keep you through your minutes and moments of terror as you wait for the LORD to answer your prayer. Listen to the pastoral and Shepherd instructions the author of this book gives to the sheep about the patience of prayer. I know Matthew 7.7 is the "Ask" verse, but you are not asking God for anything. Does God not already know what you need before you ask? The instructions in the text before us is more about praying for your soul's reception rather than your physical needs require. Let us follow the author's wisdom: "Let us therefore come boldly. Unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." In Hebrews 4, God gives the believer who obeys Him everything needed to accomplish your assigned tasks. Joshua obeyed God and found Christ was on his side-literally (Josh. 5.13-15). Unlike those who feel disbelief, Joshua exemplified the ultimate results of confident faith. The author of Hebrews 4 relates the 'spiritual sabbath" for the disciples of Christ as it continues the theme from chapter 3. The "spiritual condition of two main ingredients: affirm faith and a loyal obedience. The prayer of Hebrews 4 involves God's omnipotent, omniscient, and omnipotent cry of "help me follow your teachings and live Your life according to Your will and Word, even in unusual or seemingly unimportant circumstances.

"Let us come boldly unto the throne of grace"

Because we have a High Priest who is both omnipotent and compassionate, we can come boldly to His throne. Boldly does not mean proudly, arrogantly, or with presumption. Boldly means we may come constantly, we come without reservation, we come freely, and without fancy words, we come with confidence with persistence.

"that we may obtain mercy"

The ANE Jewish Rabbis taught God had two themes, one of mercy and one of judgment. They said this because they knew God was both merciful and just. However, you must always remember that grace does not ignore nor minimize God's justice in light of the cross.

"And find grace to help in time of need"

How thankful we should be that God provides help, healing, and a harness of hope in our souls in our time of need. No request is too small, stale, nor sinister because God wants us to be anxious for nothing, but in everything make your request of Him in prayer (Phil. 4.6).
