Safety Thru Life's Storms (Psalm 19.7-14)

Continued from last week

As you reflect upon and stick to the moment given you by our God, I want to share with you some life lines from Scripture that have been my life line thru the storms of my life. First, **James 4.7** (irrespective of the grace given to the humbled, the only thing for you to keep persistently practicing is your submitting daily to God, surrendering to him as your conquering King, and start receiving the benefits of His reign. Second, **Ephesians 4.10** (having been given the freedom of choice, this is why it is so important that your believing yields to and allows self to become overtaken by the Holy Spirit). Third, **Proverbs 29.18** (when God's Word is unavailable or rejected, the people no longer have a standard greater than their own feeling or current opinions). Did not Solomon remind you of the "**way**", the path of life one walks upon that often seems right and wonders why God or anyone else would have a different opinion. This is a reminder of how deceptive evil is Fourth, **Psalms 51.3** (do you allow Satan to cause you to grieve over the consequences of your sins or sin itself? David shows the believer how to take personal responsibility and accountability for your sin. "...I...my...,my... me"). Fifth, **Jeremiah 29.11** (Through the 6th century BCE prophet, Jeremiah, God sent a letter to the Israelite captives in Babylon about the time of their return to Jerusalem. After seventy years God would put an end to their captivity because God said to them He knows His own thoughts about them (Ps.139.17-18), where the LORD not only thinks of you, but He also thinks towards you and His thoughts are all drifting your way for your good). Sixth, **Matthew 6.33** (Your participation in being about God's kingdom building business must always be first when setting your priorities for life. Do not worry, but rather replace it with concern and compassion for kingdom of God matters. A habit or passion can only be given up for a greater habit or passion, says Spurgeon. Acts 10.34 (This was the foundation of Peter's understanding about God's gospel to the Gentiles- where God shows no partiality, where racial, ethnic, cultural, and natural limitations were eradicated; one's national background cannot and will never prevent you from access to and salvation from God. God does not see color, but only the heart; not economic status, but only the heart; not nationality, but only the heart.

In conclusion, the challenge facing every born-again believer is not to allow your social, psychological, financial, emotional, nor anthropological storms to separate you from the love of your Savior and LORD. The apostle Paul epitomized God's love for ALL humanity when he said in Romans 5.8: "*But God commandeth His love towards us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.*" Do not allow your social storms of life to deter and turn you away from God's love for you, but rather allow them to draw you to a closer walk with Him.
