The Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe Elected Presiding Bishop

The 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church meeting in Louisville, Kentucky, elected the Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe as our next Presiding Bishop. At just 49 years of age, Bishop Rowe is the youngest elected Presiding Bishop since 1789! He was the youngest bishop elected in the Episcopal Church, when he was called to be the Bishop of Northwestern Pennsylvania at the age of 32. On November 1st, 2024, Bishop Rowe will succeed Presiding Bishop, the Most Reverend Michael B. Curry. The newly elected PB acknowledged the need for change in the direction of the Episcopal Church and plans to emphasize meaningful evangelism among other relevant changes. Pray for Bishop Rowe.

When Loneliness Overwhelms—(Hebrews 13.5-6)

Yes, spending time alone is a powerful and practical way to recharge, refocus, and refresh your spirit of centering down and rising up for the next leg of your journey. However, loneliness is a different horse to prepare to ride. Because loneliness is a state of the mind, it causes the person to feel empty, alone, and unwanted. Lonely people often crave for human contact, and their state of mind makes it more difficult to form connections with others. I strongly advise the person to seek the counsel and course of a qualified Christian psychiatrist. I want to prescribe a workable Scripture prescription from Dr. Jesus. First, you must honestly ask yourself have you sincerely accepted Jesus' invitation of having a personal relationship with Him (*"Come unto Me, all you that labor and heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn of Me; for I am meek, and lowly in heart: and you shall find rest unto your souls. For My yoke is easy, and my burden is light"* Matt. 11.30). Dr. Jesus is the nearest and closest friend and physician you can ever have. Second, you must always remember that God, through His infallible and inerrant Word, promises He will never leave you nor abandon you. Moses gives to Israel his farewell speech, as the LORD prepares them to enter the Land of Promise as he encourages them (Deut. 31.6). Then, as Joshua prepares to take the reigns of leadership, the LORD assures him that He will be with him as He was with Moses (Joshua 1.5). In Psalm 27.10, David assures Israel, though father and mother may forsake you, the LORD is and will always be with you. Finally, Jesus' beloved disciple, John, assures that the LORD will never leave you as an orphan, but rather He will come to you" (14.18).

Then, on the prescriptive side, I challenge you to pray, memorize God's promises, and pray about God-minded friendships. **Pray.** Ask the LORD to help you have a critical and correct understanding of who you are as His child. The Scriptures remind you of God's unmerited and everlasting love for you (Jer. 31.3), and that He is a friend who sticks closer to you as a sibling (Prov. 18.24). **Memorize.** Not only the Scriptures I referenced above, but also the ones you have encountered and been exposed to along life's journey- ask the Holy Spirit to emblaze them onto the memory bank of your soul. The writer of Psalm 119.says: *"Your Word I have hidden in my heart that I might not sin against You"*. **Friendships.** Ask God to direct and bring you to the righteous people in your life. Did you not know that friendship is an extension of the LORD'S love and goodness in your life? Friendship is not one the greatest gifts God gives His child. Solomon hit the nail squarely on the head when said: *"one who has unreliable friends soon comes to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother"* (Prov. 18.24).
