

A Message from the New Presiding Bishop

In his inaugural sermon to the General Convention gathered in Louisville, Kentucky, the Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe said that the Episcopal Church needs to "be ready to tolerate uncertainty, make sacrifices and think differently about how the church should work so it can better share the Gospel of Jesus with a world that needs to hear it." Rowe continued, "in the work that lies ahead, we have what we might call an armour of love that will help us withstand whatever comes our way." Rowe paid tribute to the soon retiring P.B. Michael Curry, describing him as a gift to the Episcopal Church. Interestingly, attendees were asked to stand at the end of the service when, "Lift Every Voice and Sing" was sung—the standard protocol for what is commonly known as the Black National Anthem.

News from General Convention

Presiding Bishop elect the Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe and the installation planning and transition committees, have announced that the installation of the new Primate will take place November 2, 2024, at the Episcopal Church's headquarters in Manhattan, New York, instead of Washington National Cathedral, the seat of the Presiding Bishop. Bishop Rowe will be installed during a service in the Episcopal Church Center's Chapel of Christ the Lord. The service will be livestreamed, with interpretation available in multiple languages. The official seating of the P.B. will take place sometime later.

When Loneliness Overwhelms

(Hebrews 13.5-6)

Continued from last week

Regarding the myriad of visitations and socializations wrought by the global pandemic, where loved ones have been kept apart and it has become unsafe to socialize in many of the ways we were accustomed to doing, loneliness is becoming a salient social disorder. It has been reported that thirty-sic percent of Americans felt "serious loneliness" in 2020. The challenge facing you is your standing strong, playing with a picture in mind, conversing with conviction, and learn how to trust and obey the Words of Jesus. The Hebrew writer reminds the reader to "Let your conduct be without covetousness", where covetousness is the opposite of contentment. Contentment has everything to do with what you are on the inside rather than what you have. The apostle Paul is right on point in his prison epistle, Philippians 4.11-13 regarding what I have said above about overcoming your loneliness. The foundation of your contentment is what Moses said in Deuteronomy 31.6. You can only count on God rather than your material provisions.

General Convention passes Compromise Resolution

After considerable discussion and much debate, the General Convention gathering in Louisville, Kentucky, passed a resolution affirming the "Imperative of a Palestinian State." The resolution spells out the need for an Independent Palestinian State to exist alongside the State of Israel. Resolution DO13 that omitted the word "apartheid" stated that the Israeli government "continues to commit acts and pass laws that result in fragmentation, segregation and dispossession against the Palestinian people and the Occupied territories."

Finally, our own Bryon Greene was a deputy at General Convention 2024, and we hope to hear from him shortly.
