Calm in The Midst of Chaos

(Psalm 107.23-32)

When I came home from college in May 1982, I was determined to prepare and develop myself with a skill that would last and lead me for service in the church. I wanted to learn how to play the piano. This young lady I was dating was a trained and accomplished pianist and middle school music teacher. When I was not in class with her or other friends who were gifted piano players and music readers, I would use some of my time with her to work on my intended craft. The young lady did not mince her words with me about my personal practice playing time. She simply said, "James, you ain't got it. After months of my lessons with you, you are not making any progress. This may be the sign that piano playing is not for you." How depressed and discouraged I became. She went to say to me, "James, when you are practicing the walls vibrate and there is no peace nor pleasantries during my nap time. Yet, I continued to press on with my practicing, but to no avail. She informed me of the young lady next door whom she taught to play the piano years earlier, and always greeted her ears with the playing of "Amazing Grace." She witnessed to me how the melodious notes from John Newton's hymn soothed her soul, healed her heart from her disgust with my pecking and not playing the notes appropriately. However, that experience gave me my first introduction to how God's grace gives calm, clarity, and consolation to your quivering soul, even during your time of chaos. No matter how loud, lousy, and lethargic are the moments of disappointment God's notes of grace rings with hope and healing to your being and gives sanctuary to your quivering soul.

Here in Psalm 107, the sailors are struggling mightily against a dangerous storm that was about to wipe them out. I have stopped by to inform you that it is not the weather storms of nature that will wipe you out, but rather there are some emotional, social, psychological, relational, personal, private, intellectual, and mental storm that will wipe you out and destroy and permanently cripple, confine, and confiscate your devotional dexterity as well.

Yes, even in the presence of Jesus' Spirit you will encounter and experience storms in this life, but we must never forget what He said from the pen of the apostle John: "*These things I have spoken unto you, that in Me you might have peace. In the world you shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world.*" This psalter before you, give some powerful instructions of what must be done so as to allow you to walk with serenity amidst your storms of life. I want to remind you that the Bible teaches us there are three kinds of storms in life. First, storms that we bring on ourselves (like Samson); second, storms that God causes (like Lake Galilee); third, storms that other people cause (as when Paul and Silas were thrown into prison). But we must always remember that our God is always on board during every storm in our lives.
