

Calm in The Midst of Chaos (Psalm 107.23-32)

Continued from last week

Did you not know that every storm is made to fulfill God's Word over our lives? Always remember what the writer of Psalm 148.8 says: *"Fire, and hail; and vapor; stormy and fulfilling His word."* The Holy Spirit is in you and with you- He knows the way through every storm; God will never leave you nor forsake you in the storms of your life, no matter what the source (Heb. 13.8). The late Dr. Gardner Calvin Taylor used to say: "All three storms are common to humanity, but you are an uncommon person, uniquely created with purpose and destiny...." The storms you significantly navigate become a testimony to others. You are a storm riding and rafting child of El Shaddai.

Pay attention to the three storm anchors given by the psalmist. Listen to what he says in v. 28a: "...their soul is melted because of trouble." Whether you know it or not there is a ship in which we are all riding; there is a troubled sea on which we all sail, but there is a God who is the Captain of our soul. The psalmist goes on to say in v. 28b: "Then they cried unto the LORD in their trouble.' You must learn how not to hide nor hold onto trouble in your life. God is always available and ready to assist you, but you first must learn what He will do – He brought them out of their distress (and He will do the same for you if you trust and obey Him). Finally, the psalmist goes on to say in v. 30: "Then they are glad because they be quiet." The late Dr. Howard Thurman said to us in chapel service one morning what he told the late Dr. Vernon Jordan, as he lay in the hospital recovering from a gunshot wound from a would be assassin's bullet: "If you trust Him, to take care of you, God will bring you and shield you, heal you, and safely land you in your desired haven."

In your time of chaos, whether it is life-threatening or sleep deprivation, do not allow the noise, fear, frustration, and your fainting spirit to throw you off your spiritual navigation system away from His Name. As our Federal Reserve Bank prints out on our money, I challenge you to place these words in the center of your sanctified soul- "In God we trust."
