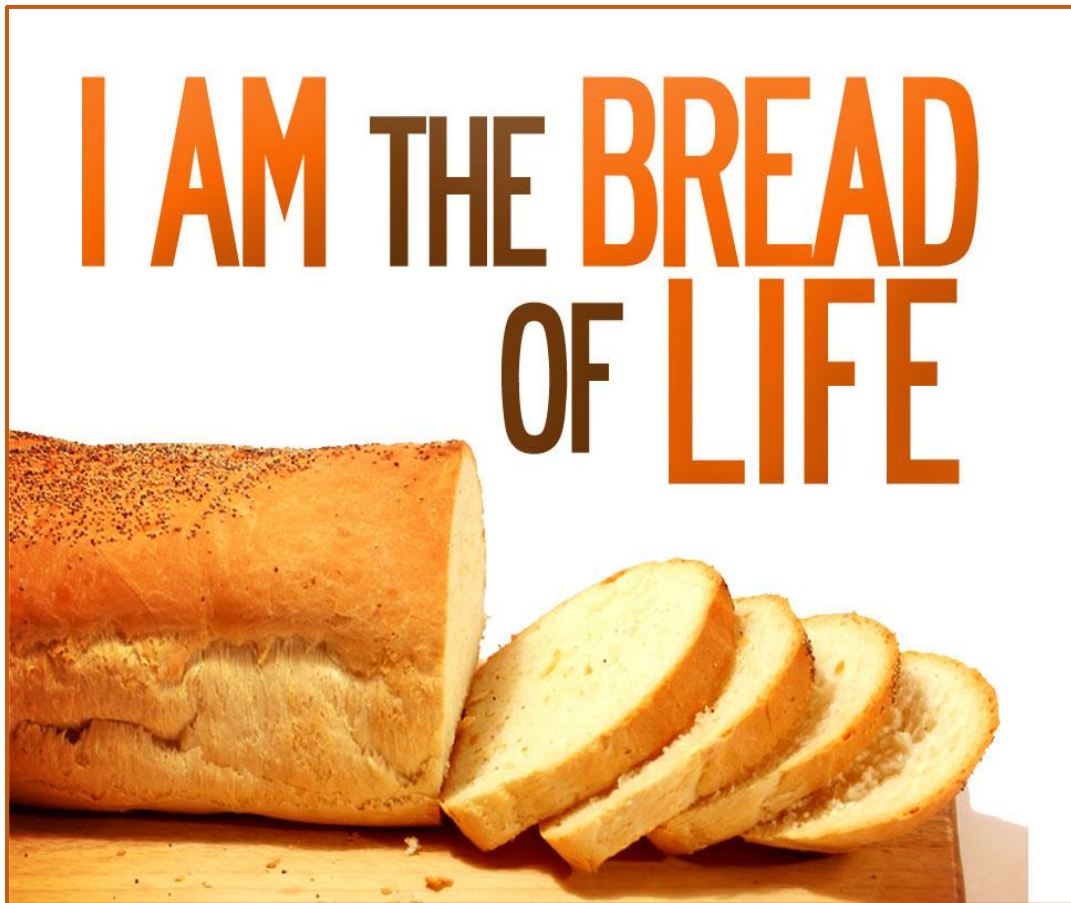

Between The Before and After The Dash

(II Timothy 4.1-8)

I believe Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr, was prophetically onto something when he said on 3 April 1968 (in what King scholars have concluded was his own personal eulogy, given at the Charles Mason Temple in Memphis, Tennessee) when he said: *“Longevity has its place in life, but it is not the quantity of years you live, but rather the quality of the years you live.”* It was the late gospel singer, Mahalia Jackson, who sealed King’s words into perpetuity when she sang: *“If I can help somebody as I journey along, then my living will not be in vain.”* Then, the Danish theologian Soren Kierkegaard, qualified King’s words when he said: *“Life is always lived forward, but it is only understood when viewed backwards.”* In other words, Kierkegaard and King and Jackson challenged us to arrive at a season in our lives where you prepare to make sense of things in your past so as to prepare you for a better future. This is why I have concluded that what is really important in living is what you do for the LORD from the date of your entrance (birth) to the date of your exit (transition) known as the “dash.” Graduate from college, but make sure you receive your B.A. degree from Soul Saving University. Learn all you can in school, but do not neglect your service to the Savior of Sinners. Enjoy your career, but your satisfaction will only come from your call and commission by Christ Jesus. Study the languages of the world, but do not forget to learn how to love everybody. Do not fret over what you have forgotten, but do not forget how to forgive. Travel the states, but study and search the Scriptures. Broaden your mind with reading and writing, but bless your manners with a message from the Master who declared, *“I am the Way, the Truth, and the Light.”* The plan and place of your life and living have everything to do with what you do between the before and after the dash.

It was a 103-year young woman named Man Kaur, who competed as India’s oldest female athlete during the World Masters Champions live in Poland. Remarkably, Kaur won gold in four events (javelin throw, shot put, 60-meter dash, and 200-metre run). But more amazingly was the fact she ran faster than she ran in the 2017 championship. A great-grandmother running into her second century, Kaur showed how to finish strong. As servants of the risen Savior, we have been commissioned to run life’s race until the end. No vacation, no retirement plan, no hanging out on the corner, no down time in your man/woman cave, and no silence only sacrificial service for the Savior.
