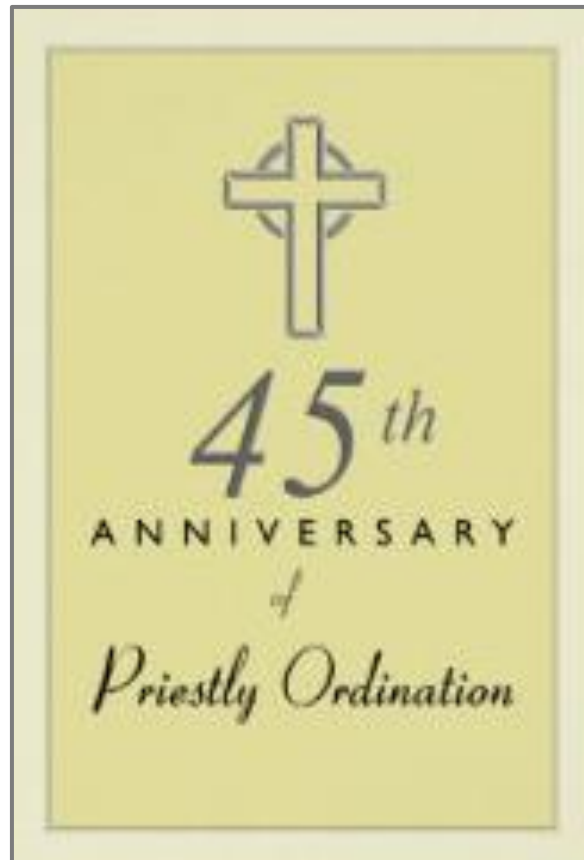

45 years and Counting

I still remember what this little old lady said to me the day of my ordination—"Father I plan to pray for you but regardless where you go after now, I want you to walk with Kings and not lose the common touch." I pray that I have remained faithful, humble and steadfast to God's call upon my life.

Between The Before and After The Dash—(II Timothy 4.1-8)

Continued from last week

How unfortunate it is that western believers view life linearly, whereas eastern believers view life cyclically. Consequently, we westerners believe life continues then ends. In these words, the apostle Paul was encouraging Timothy that his work on this side of the dirt will one day come to an end. Keeping the faith literally means your continuing to believe in truth, trust and obey, and support the cause of Christ regardless of life's difficulties. Play poorly at times, but pray persistently and practically at all times for the LORD'S will to be done on earth thru you. Fourth, Paul said: "*Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness*" (4.8a). It is on the exit side of the dash there is a crown, a prize, and a reward for the dedicated, the devoted, and the disciplined believer. Paul knew there was a crown waiting for him in heaven. The New Testament word for crown (*stephanos*) is called the victor's crown, atrophy recognizing that one had completed according to the rules and had won the victory. Paul wanted Timothy (and you and me) to remember we have been promised by our LORD and Savior, Jesus (the) Christ the crown of life if we will endure temptation (Jas. 1.12). However, Rev. 4.10 is a reminder to every believer that that elders surrounding the throne of God took their crowns and cast them before Jesus-giving any trophy they have received right back to Jesus (Guzik).

The challenge facing every believer in the body of Christ is not your focusing on the crown on the other side, but rather your bearing your cross on this side (*passio passiva- "suffering because I must"*), giving our God His due praise and glorifying Him. The crown will take care of itself (Spurgeon).
