People Who Need People—(Romans 16.3-16)

Why has the church of God in Christ been the last group to know that we were created to be participating partners, active allies, networking nerds, and a covert colorless community of certified card-carrying crusaders who know they are all caught in an inescapable and interlocking web of family, friendship, fellowship, and faith for the betterment of God's beloved community? Why is the church so divided on race, when it has been shown and proven there is only one human race- homo sapien habilis erectus? Why has the church of God in Christ been so ambivalent about people who are different in their lifestyle than ours? When will the church of God in Christ learn that differences and diversities do not mean deficiency, but rather strength and security? Why has the church not come to know the unity and the uniformity of the Spirit, where the apostle Paul reminds us: "In Christ, there is neither bond nor free, Jew nor Greek, male nor female, but we are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal. 3.28). Why are the people in the pulpits and the people in the pews of the church not reading and signing from the same sheet of music with respect to homosexuality, gays, lesbians, LGBTQ, anti-Semitism, racism, sexism, and transgender issues? Why is the church so silent about dirty deacons, pimp preachers and pastors, partying parishioners, and convention conspirators who all claim allegiance to Christ Jesus, but are so noisy on other infidelities? When will the people of God accept and acknowledge the truth of Scriptures: "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Rms. 3.23? The simple answer is- because we have not come to know that we as people always and will forever need each other.

I do not care how you try to paint and present him, once Paul encountered and experienced Christ Jesus on the Damascus Road, his outlook on life was a radical paradigm shift from his previous life. He went from being a serial and serious killer of Christians, to that of a die-hard crusader for Christ. He went from being a religious rascal as a Jew, to that of a devoted disciple of His Resurrected Redeemer. It was this legendary 1st century apostle of Christ Jesus who learned from, leaned and depended on those whom he met along his four missionary journeys that he called out and offered Christ to them. Paul knew that his significance (not success) as an apostle for Christ Jesus depended on and was solely because he was indebted to everybody. Do we not realize as humans created in the *imago dei* "owe" our very being to one another?
