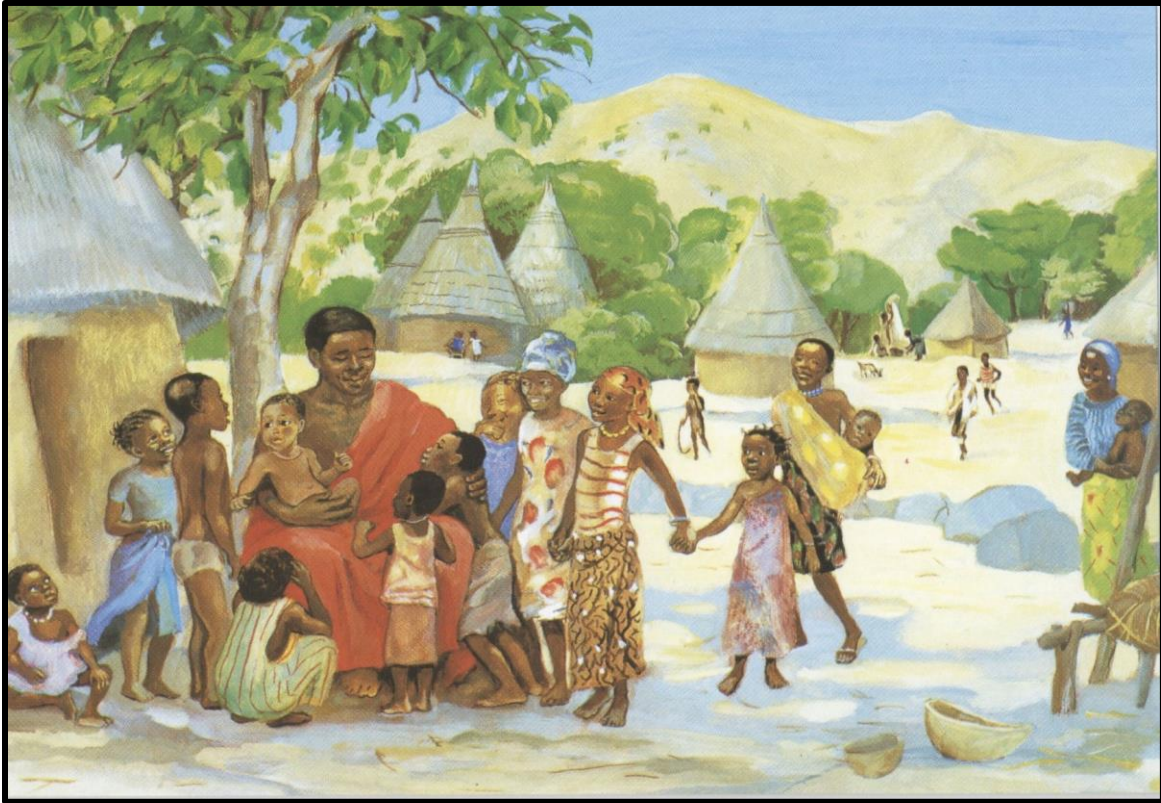

People Who Need People—(Romans 16.3-16)

It was Pastor Kropotkin who wrote in his article, “Conquest of Bread,” where he argues that because we all exist and build off of the work that previous humans have done, as far as scientific and artistic development, discoveries, etc go, we owe it to one another to work toward the good of the collective rather than the individual. Kropotkin goes on to argue that anything we invent, we owe to the rest of humanity because we could never have invented it without the work of those who came before us. “Do we as a society accrue some sort of debt to collective humanity in any way at all?”, asks Kropotkin.

Have you paid meticulous attention to how Paul greeted and saluted all sorts of people as he closed the Romans epistle in chapter 16? He wrote, “I commend to you Phoebe our sister...a servant,...; that you receive her in the LORD, ...; Grant Priscilla and Aquila my helpers in Christ Jesus; Greet Andronicus and Junia, my fellow prisoners; Great Ampliatus, my dear friend in the LORD;... Salute Tryphena and Tryphosa, who labored in the LORD;... Salute Asynecritus, Phlegon, Hermas, Patrobas, Hermes, and the brethren, which are with them.” In this chapter, Paul mentions 36 persons (women and men), where he used the word “*greet*” five times. Most of the persons mentioned by Paul are never mentioned again in Scripture, but Paul wanted to mention all the people who helped him during his missionary work.

Who is your mentor/mentee who has helped you along the way with a sense of community and purpose? They needed him just as much he needed them. Paul concludes his letter by instructing the readers to greet each other with a “holy kiss.” Though foreign to us here in the West, such practice in the early church was a common greeting between friends in many cultures throughout human history. It was practical in the early church as a way of confirming the sibling bond of love between believers in Christ, where Paul referred to it as a “holy kiss” to set it apart from other kinds of kissing. The “holy kiss” was Paul’s way of building community and experiencing the Spirit’s presence among believers. The “holy kiss” was Paul’s way of identifying and signifying innocent affection without any hint of sensuality or impropriety. The “holy kiss” in those early years of the church was adopted and gave a deeper meaning as a sign of their unity in Christ. At the end of the day the ‘holy kiss’ was viewed as a Christian greeting that symbolizes love, friendship, and respect. It was also known as a kiss of peace or a kiss of charity. The “holy kiss” is only mentioned five times in the New Testament (Rms. 16.16; 1 Cor. 16.20; 2 Cor. 13.12; 1 Thess. 5.26; and 1 Ptr. 5.14). I appreciate what Bishop Cyprian said about the “holy kiss”: “Christians should be ‘love doves’ who exchange the kiss as a mark of innocent affection.” St. Augustine said: “The ‘holy kiss’ demonstrated their inward peace by their outward kiss.”
