RECTOR'S DESK

Practice or Perform Prayer

(Philippians 4.6; I Thessalonians 5.17; Hebrews 4.16)

The late and renown 18th century Particular Baptist preacher and former pastor of the Metropolitan Tabernacle Church in London, England for 38 years, Charles Haddon Spurgeon, said this about prayer: "True prayer is neither a mere mental exercise nor a vocal performance. It is far deeper than that- it is spiritual transaction with the Creator of Heaven Earth." If the truth be told, we modern latter-day saints' disciples of Christ authentic prayer warriors or are we first class performing prayer artist who simply talk about prayer rather than live prayer in our daily walk with the LORD? If the truth be told, according to the Word of God, praying should be as natural and easy as breathing is for the human body. Prayer is as prime and practical to life and living, as is the Spirit to the soul. Believe it or not, prayer is a form of serving God (Luke 2.36-38) and obeying Him. We have been called and commissioned to pray because it is exemplified for us by Christ and the early church (Mark 1.35; Acts 1.14) 2.42; 3.1; 4.23-31; 6.4; 13.1-3). I have come to learn that the Bible makes clear there are essentially five reasons why God beckons believers to pray: (1) we are called to pray in preparation for major decisions (Luke 6.12-13); (2) we are called to pray to overcome demonic barriers (Matthew 17.14-21); (3) we pray to gather workers for the spiritual harvest (Luke 10.2); (4) we pray to give strength to overcome temptation (Matthew 26.41); and (5) we pray to obtain the means of strengthening others spiritually (Ephesians 6.18-19). What is so important every believer must learn about the mechanics of prayer are two-fold: prayer is not your bringing anything to God about your social or spiritual situation that He is not already cognizant of and God promises that our prayers to Him are not even in vain, even if we do not receive a specific answer to what we asked of Him (Matthews 6.6; Romans 8.26-27). God has promised when we ask for anything according to His will, He will give us what we ask for (1 John 5.14-15). Let us remember the immortal words of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. who said "a delayed prayer answer is not a denied prayer." Prayer is also not our using the LORD as our errand boy for Him to do what He has already called and equipped us to do. An un-prayed prayer is usually an unanswered prayer. For example, if the Syrian woman with the demon-influenced daughter had not prayed to Christ, her daughter definitely would not have been made whole (Mark 7.26-30). If the blind man outside of Jericho had not called out to Christ, he would have remained blind (Luke 18.35-43). God Himself has made it clear that we so often go without because we do not ask (James 4.2). It was John Calvin, the French Protestant Reformation theologian, pastor and reformer in Geneva in the 16th century, who placed great emphasis on the importance of prayer, saying: "Words fail to explain how necessary prayer is.... (Institutes III, 20,2). Calvin held that it is, ".... By the benefit of prayer we reach those riches which are laid up for us with the Heavenly Father" and that"after we have been instructed by faith to recognize that whatever we need and whatever we lack is in God...it remains for us to seek in Him, and in prayers to ask of Him, what we have learned to be in Him" (Institutes, III, 20.1).
