

The Perfection of Prayer—(Philippians 3.4-7)

How often have you heard the word pray, prayer, and praying used in the religious vernacular as though we all are professional prayer practitioners, expert equivocators in our prayer behavior, and star students in the prayer honor society of the LORD Jesus (the) Christ. But if the truth be told, do we really know about, knowledgeable of, and are kinesthetic learners of the discipline, direction, and duty of prayer? I must admit that I am still a student in training, soul in search of, and a saint of the Savior who still cries out daily, "LORD, teach me how to pray." For the past few years, I have been begging the LORD to help me settle and center down in my prayer posture time with Him. I will be the first to admit I have not been obedient in doing what the apostle Paul said to the church of Thessalonica about praying: "In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (5.18). Furthermore, I have not done what else Paul instructed the Thessalonian Christians to do: "Pray without ceasing" (5.17). There are two books I have begun to reread and spend time spiritually cogitating on by the late mystic theologian Dr. Howard W. Thurman: The Centering Moment (1969) and Disciplines of The Spirit (1963). I agree with Thurman as he quotes the late Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, who prophetically said: "The issue of prayer is not prayer, the issue of prayer is God." How many believers really know, as Jesus knew, the most precious time of the day was not at the close of the day, when He opened and ovulated His heart to His Father. I will say more about this at another time.

I did not know in my early conversion years that at the moment of conversion, God in Christ Jesus gave us the privilege of talking to and with Him at any time and about anything. Whether we know it, or accept it, or acknowledge it, the Christian life is ground and groomed in a personal relationship with God through His Son, Christ Jesus. This is all about relationship that will last for all eternity. The believer must always remember that prayer is spiritual communication between the Creator and the created God manumitted a two-way relationship by which the man should not only talk to God, but listen to him as well. The Word of God is filled with promises that encourage us to pray: *"He shall call upon Me and I will answer him: I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him and I will declare Him"* (Psalm 91.15); *"And it shall come to past that before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear"* (Isaiah 65.24); Ask and it will be given to you, seek and you will find, knock the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7.7) Our LORD, Savior and heavenly Father does hear and answer our prayers.
