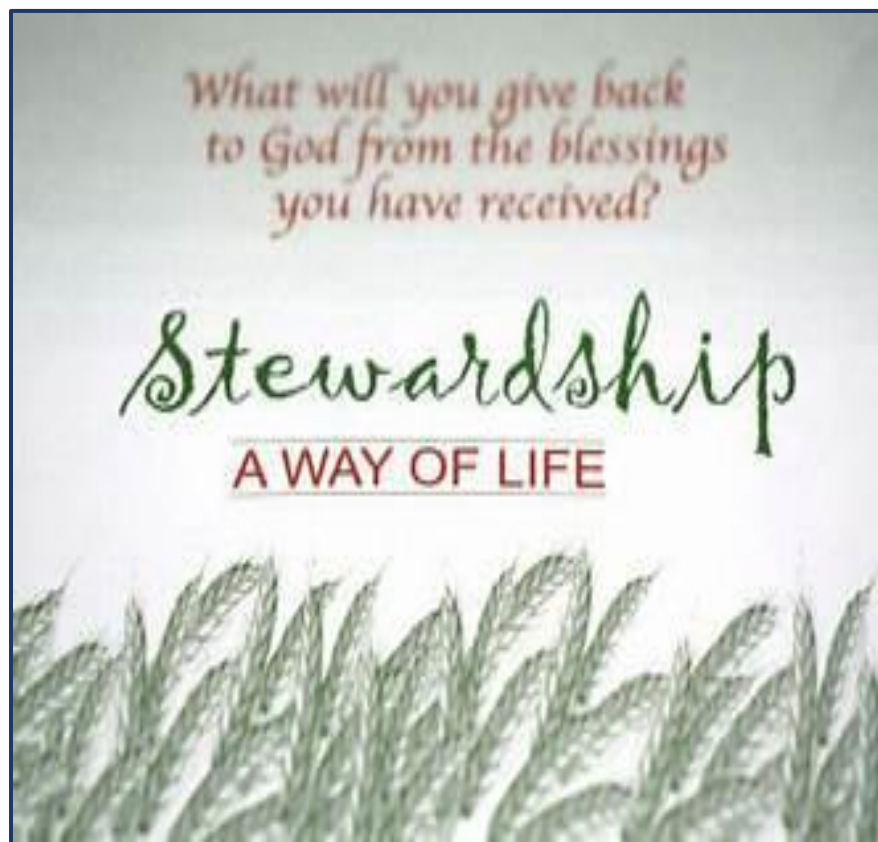

With the Lord

John Grayson now may be a household name in Irvington, New Jersey, all because of what I told a gathering of what he reminded me of in his condolence call – pray, hang on to your faith and keep it moving. In a piece of delicious irony, John now has to follow his own advice, as Cassandra is left to deal with another death in her family. So yes as a family, we prayed, reminded each other that the life we share is fragile, but the faith we embrace gives us hope in the most troubling of circumstances, particularly the unexpected and certainly when the icy hands of death snatches our loved ones away. Even as we grieve, and we must, there is the admonition that we as believers are not to grieve as though we have no hope. Our shared hope is that we will stand around God's throne in glory one day, when we will be reunited with all those who predeceased us.

Back to Jersey, where there is a large concentration of Guyanese/Americans who came out on Friday evening (at the wake) and certainly at the funeral service on Saturday, as well as the repast. Much of this can be attributed to Louis who celebrated every day of his life with his friends making sure that there were no sad faces whenever they gathered. Louis seemed to have inherited the Bennetts propensity for humor, and so Genevieve and I ran into an avalanche of his best hits - and what helped was the liquid refreshments that were served in abundance.

So Louis was always socializing, playing dominoes and always present at parties. However and whenever he returned home his girlfriend told us, he always read his bible, and said his prayers before heading to bed. So he epitomized what John said (in his own way), did his prayers, stayed close to word but kept it moving.

I am sure that when the Lord looks around and sees the angels grinning, He will know that Louis has joined the company of the saints in Light.

May he rest in peace. Amen.
