FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Advent Season

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word—"Adventus" which is translated "coming". This ecclesiastical season precedes the great Festival of Christmas (our Lord's nativity). Advent Sunday then is the first day of this season and this year it immediately follows St. Andrew's Day (November 30th). Just to remind ourselves, Advent Sunday is traditionally the day on which the ecclesiastical year begins. In former times, the Advent Season was viewed as the "lesser lent" and the church encouraged its followers to fast and avoid all festivities. The liturgical color used is always purple and the "glorias" are omitted from the celebration of the Eucharist. The Season of Advent is observed as a time of preparation not only for Christmas but also for the Second Coming of the Christ (Parousia) who will return to judge both the living and the dead on the Last Day.
