Rector to go on Sabbatical

The rector will proceed on Sabbatical as of January 1, 2025, and return February 1, 2025. The canons of the Episcopal Church dictate and recommend that after a priest has served in a parish for six (6) continuous years, he/she is entitled to a sabbatical (leave) between one (1) and three (3) months. Fr. Hugh completed his seventh year in September, and therefore the vestry at the urging of Bishop Scott Benhase, has granted him this special time away. During his absence, the Senior Warden Dr. Shaun Laurie will have full responsibility for the parish, and he will be assisted by the Junior Warden Charlie Clark, the Clerk of Vestry Margaret Edwards and the Treasurer Laureatte Scott. In his absence the parish will be served by two (2) priests Mtr. Leslie Roraback of St. John's Episcopal (January 12th) and Fr. Swelion Lewis of Liberia (19th). For January 5th and 26th our worship leaders will offer Morning Prayer and there will be two (2) guest preachers. In the event of a pastoral emergency (sudden illness requiring the presence of a priest), the office is to be contacted immediately (Margaret, Charlie or Elizabeth), and they will ensure that a priest is made available to address the concern. Fr. Lonnie Lacy of St. John's will work closely with our Ministry Team during the absence of the rector.

Spencer Stapleton Passes

Spencer Stapleton, the former senior warden of our rector when he served at St. Ursula's Episcopal Church in the Virgin Islands, passed from time to eternity on Christmas Eve. He has left to mourn his daughter Yvette and Spencer Jr. of North Carolina. Spencer was a founding member of St. Ursula episcopal Church on the island of St. John. His wife Camilla predeceased him just over two years ago. At this time we ask that you keep his loved ones and relatives in your prayers, especially his grandchildren and great grandchildren. FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Christmas Story

On this first Sunday after the great festival of Christmas, let us look again at what our God did for this world. We remember especially the fortitude shown by the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was very pregnant with Jesus, and yet made the perilous trip to Bethlehem, just so she could support Joseph to whom she was engaged at the time.

Adding to her great discomfort, was the mode of transport available – a donkey upon which she sat for hours on end! And then when they got to Bethlehem, there was no proper accommodation, not even a cheap hotel (no room in the inn). Mary had to settle for a stable, a place where animals were kept for the winter, and I often think of that dark, smelly and chaotic scene that confronted this teenage mother getting ready to give birth to the savior of the world. How paradoxical, the Prince of Peace, the King of Glory, God's only Son, when he came to this world, there was no pageantry or midwife to help at the moment of delivery. Can you picture it? Yet, there was no complaint, unless the evangelists failed to make mention of it. Instead Mary did what mothers do for us, care, cuddle and console her infant, who must have wondered about the gaze of those animals and the strange sounds that they made!!

Some theologians of our church, have described the birth of our Lord as nothing short of a scandal – as if to say what was God thinking, allowing His only begotten son to be born in a manger in the midst of winter! They say the scandal did not end there, for in fact this Son grew up in a working class family that perhaps stayed just above the poverty level. And of course we know what happened to Jesus at Calvary for going about doing good. Jesus ended up dying like a common criminal, abandoned by those who promised to never leave or forsake Him. Time does not permit me to make reference to the insults and naked opposition that Jesus faced as he sought to minister trying to tell those who listen, about God's love, as He went about feeding the hungry and healing broken bodies and minds. Look what Jesus got for living and doing what God wanted and asked Him to do!

Have we thought about what we are being expected to do for Him in this world or what we may be called to do for Him in 2025? Our world is markedly different from the first century, but still there is hostility, cruelty and a stench because of the poverty and inhumanity that pervades our country and yes, our World! So will we still follow Jesus and help Him make this world a better place? Pray we will all do. Happy New Year.
