Accepting Criticism

(Proverbs 10:17-10)

Have you ever encountered anyone who welcomes and accepts criticism as a necessity of life? Though it can be both positive and productive, criticism is not something anyone stands on the street corner flagging down. If the truth be told, no one welcomes criticism because it is often unsolicited and, in most cases, not fun. However, I have come to learn over the years that criticism, given in the right tone of voice and with the right purpose and plan in mind, can be very helpful. Though often never solicited and usually not fun, we serve a God who is able to take an arrogant attitude and still bring something amicable out of what we need to hear.

The challenge facing everyone is to learn how to pay attention, listen to, and navigate through the criticism being leveled at you. Invited or not, criticism gives you the opportunity to examine yourself, reflect, take notice of your faults, and learn from them. Perhaps the Greek philosopher, Socrates, was onto something when he said to his students: "The unexamined life is not worth living," written in Plato's Apology. Those words were rendered by Socrates during his trial for impiety and corrupting the youth in 399 BCE. Those words were what Plato called the city's slanders against him. In the quote Socrates was suggesting that any unexamined life is one that lacks meaning and purpose, and that only by striving to understand yourself can your life come to have value. Socrates believed that without your questioning the world and things around you, you will act without reason and be unable to distinguish between good and bad actions. Therefore, if you fail to learn and listen, your potential for mental, emotional, and spiritual growth will be limited (Prov. 15:31).

Your assignment, then, is not to ignore the criticism, but rather investigate it correctly. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said it best when he said, "Not everything that comes across my desk warrants my attention." First, you must feverishly focus on not rejecting the criticism, but rather try to investigate so as to learn whether or not what was said is of value and ask God if He is trying to tell you something. The Bible offers some invaluable guidance on criticism, where the apostle Paul told the Ephesian church believers "speaking the truth in love" should be the primary guide for criticism. Then, though I know it may be tough, initiate your giving "thank you" to the person because they have added to your spiritual, emotional, and self-awareness growth.
