Is Jesus Your Friend?

(John 15.13-15)

It is without question that Christ Jesus is our LORD, Savior, Master, Counselor, Way Maker, Doctor, Lawyer, and Potter, but do you also know of Him as your friend? The Scriptures are exhaustive concerning Jesus is our friend, a friend who sticks closer than a brother (Proverbs 18.24). The Gospel calls us to trust Jesus as our Savior, submit to Him as our King, obey Him as our LORD and Master, and value Him as our Treasure. But more than anything, the Gospel also calls us to enjoy, encounter, and explore Jesus as your friend. Jesus is our friend, but not of equal status. For example, yes Jesus washed His disciples' feet, but His subsequent teaching (John 15:13-15) and His repeatedly calling and commanding them to obey His commands (John 13:35; 14:15,21,23-24), where a friend of Jesus is an obedient and subordinate servant.

If you do not read and reflect on the text meticulously, you will miss what Jesus is talking about when He calls His followers friend. In the John 15 text, Jesus is referring to friendship with Him as "reciprocity" and "obligation". In teaching about the vine and branches, Jesus is unequivocal in making the point that we can do nothing without Him (John 15.5). Therefore, Jesus' ultimate definition of friendship with Him simply means we have a relationship with Him that demands obedience: "You are my friends if you do what I command you" (John 15.14).

For me, the unique benefit of our being a friend of Christ Jesus is the "access to the Father" which only He gives. The benefit of friendship with the LORD is how He (Jesus) brokers our access to His Daddy. In the ancient world of the Roman Empire, when the slave was set free, once that relationship was redefined after the manumission, they became a client to the former master, pleading life long loyalty. The sole benefit of the manumitted slave was they now could exercise and experience a vertical relationship with their master, moving from social death to social life. This newfound relationship in Jesus' discussion is how He "brokers" access to His Daddy. I believe Sophocles, in his play (Oedipus the King, 771-74) talks about the master functions as a broker, where Jesus declares "no one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6) and to "ask the Father in My Name" (John 15:16).
