Memorial Day (originally known as Decoration Day) is the day set aside for us as a nation, to honor and mourn U.S. military personnel who died while serving in the armed forces. It is observed on the last Monday of May when cemeteries are visited, and other forms of memorials are held. The first observance of Memorial Day occurred on May 30th, 1868. In 1968, Congress changed its observance to the last Monday in May, and in 1971 standardized its name as "Memorial Day".
