FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Father's Day

As we observe Father's Day here at SMAA, let us thank God for all fathers everywhere, particularly those who answer the call to discharge their responsibilities, in truly challenging times. The origins of Father's Day, date back to 1910 in Spokane, Washington, when a woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, originally conceived of the idea of honoring fathers. Convinced by a sermon she heard on Mother's Day in 1909, Dodd believed that fathers should be given equal honors! Her own father, a Civil War veteran, had raised Sonora and her siblings alone after their mother had passed—that left a lasting impression on her. Dodd's work eventually resulted in the first official Father's Day on June 19, 1910—a formal recognition of the day, followed. In 1972 the day was officially recognized as a national holiday in the US, when then President Richard Nixon signed it into law.

Father's Day, which has become (almost) as commercialized as Mother's Day, ought to remind us as a society, of the importance of having fathers in our homes and in the lives of our children. We need fathers and father figures more now than ever! Yes, fathers who teach fundamental values of love, self-discipline and courage—that seem to be in short supply these days. Evidently, whatever a child sees, he or she learns, and also from their fathers gain inherent values of honesty and integrity. Beyond a doubt, our society benefits from having strong, religious and focused fathers who make every effort to sacrifice, work hard and be a presence in the lives of their children always.
