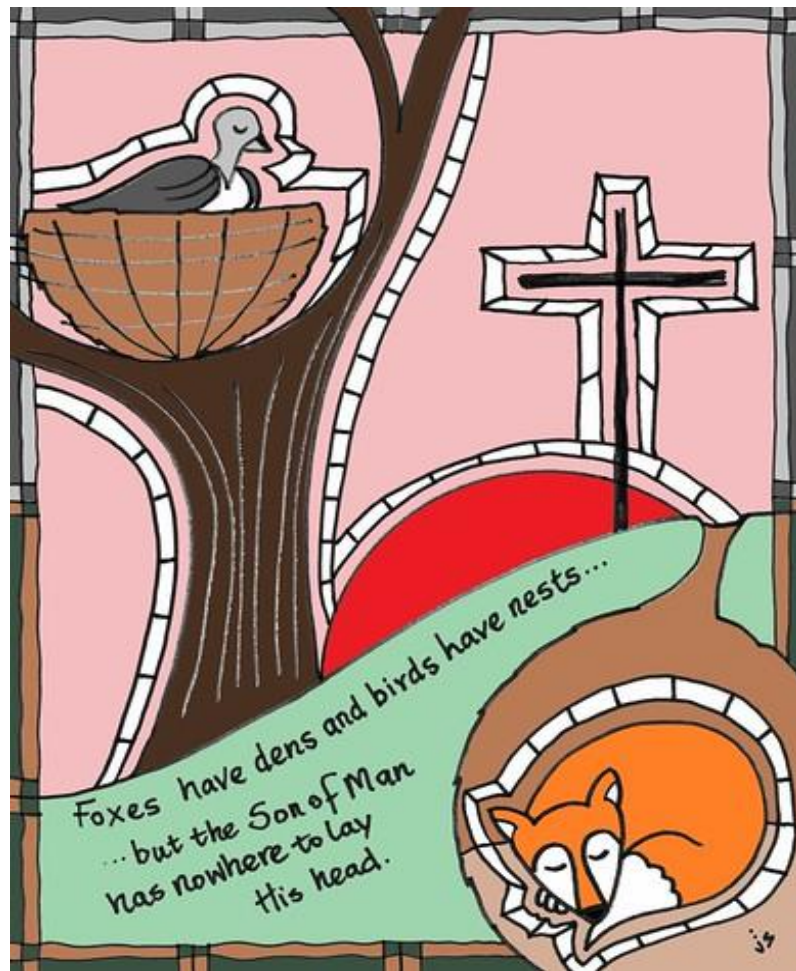

CAJM Update

On Tuesday, July 8th at 3:00 pm. the Leon County Commission will vote to ratify the affordable housing budget. The meeting is scheduled for The Leon Courthouse (5th floor, 301 S. Monroe St.). A \$500,000 (annual) proposal will be voted on to secure funds for affordable housing. This has been one of the many initiatives that CAJM has been advocating for. As we have also indicated elsewhere, Byran Stringer will begin serving as the new Executive Director of CAJM as of July 1st, 2025, while Apostle Otis B. Young-will succeed the Rev. Dr. Latricia Scriven as the new co-president, as she will now be serving in Central Florida.

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Report on Special Meeting of the Diocese

The Special Meeting of the Episcopal Diocese of Florida convened on Saturday, June 14 at the Camp Weed in Suwanee, Florida. The proceedings were concluded promptly, after three hours of discussion and review of the proposed rules for the upcoming Diocesan Convention. The rules were adopted unanimously with 200 votes in favor.

There were, over the course of the afternoon, a number of procedural queries regarding quorum, credentials, and the relative authority of the Rules to be adopted and the Diocesan Canons. However, no substantive changes were made to the proposed rules during the course of the Special Meeting. Matters raised were resolved not by debate, but by the parliamentarian serving at the behest of the Standing Committee. The delegates will reconvene in September for the Convention.

The Standing Committee has also selected a consultant to advise the Search Committee throughout the bishop selection process. The Reverend Mile Ehmer, of Lubbock, Texas, is a retired Canon of the Diocese of Northwest Texas, and a retired Lieutenant Colonel of the US Air Force. He will be aiding the Search Committee in their deliberations and review of potential candidates for the Diocesan Bishop.

At this time, the Diocese is now accepting nominations for those who feel called to serve in the Search and Transition Committees. The president of the Standing Committee emphasized the desire that the Search Committee and Transition Committee be representative and reflective of the diversity of the Diocese. Those interested in putting their names forward for consideration to sit on these Committees are encouraged to do so in the coming months. St Michael's was represented in the last Search Committee by Father Chapman, and it is important to continue to have a voice in the Search Committee.

The selection of the next Bishop will not take place until the subsequent September 2026, on the 11th, and if necessary, the 12th of that month. The schedule of the next year and a half will first involve the filling of the search and transition committees, followed by the identification of a slate of potential candidates, from within and without the diocese concluding in the following September with a vote to determine God willing, the next bishop of the Diocese of Florida.
