

The Gun Violence Epidemic

Our Episcopal Church continues to be concerned about the Gun Violence Epidemic plaguing our country—we all should be. Recent statistics indicate that more than 20,000 persons have been killed or injured by firearms in our country. Indeed, the epidemic of gun violence affects people from all of our committees and continues to be one of the most pervasive problems of our time

Congress, we believe, has the responsibility and authority to enact proven strategies to reduce gun violence. Including investing in gun violence prevention programs, regulating firearm possession and purchases, and closing legal loopholes that endanger our communities.

Admittedly, we have seen some small steps made in recent years, but they are hardly sufficient. The National Church is calling us to action, and suggesting that we let members of Congress know that the issue of gun violence remains as urgent as ever, and that we demand they support effective legislative suggestions.
