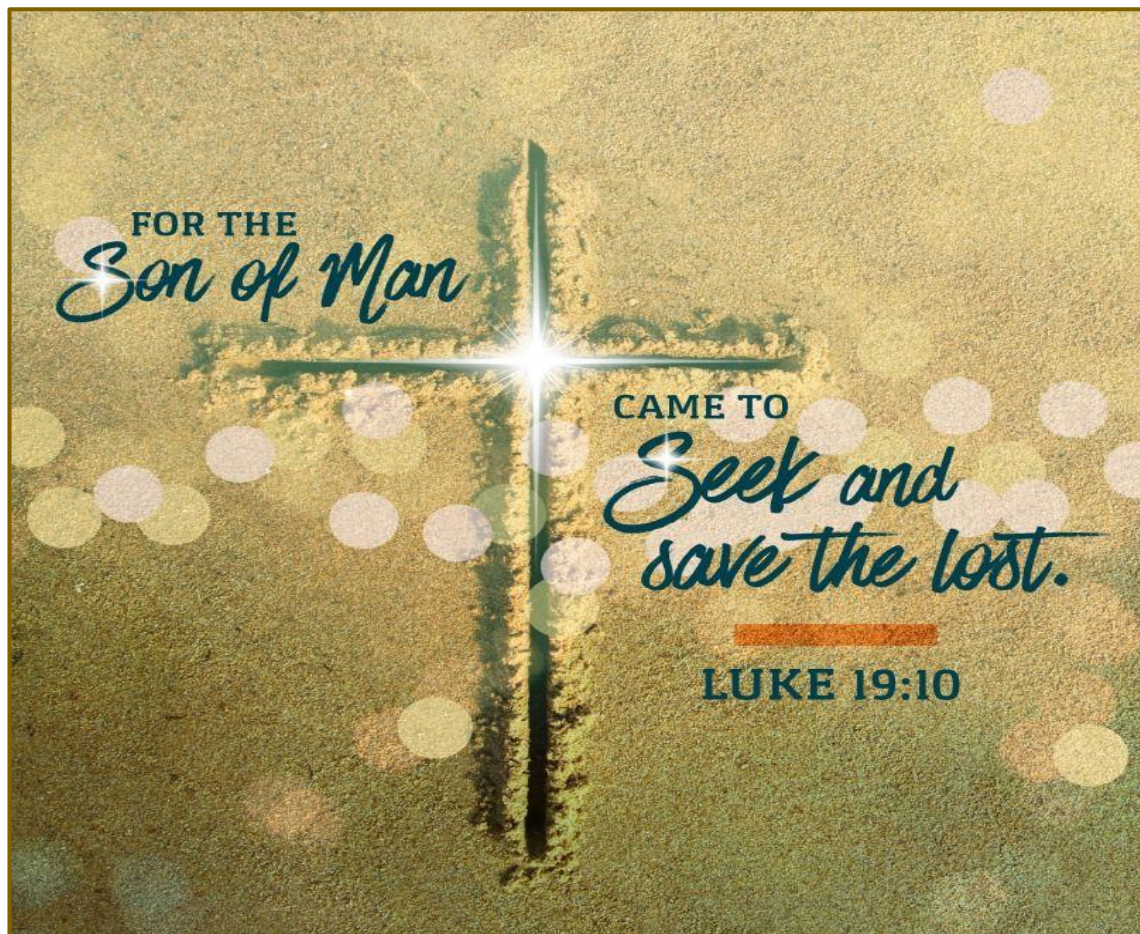

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Looking back on a Successful Network Assembly

The CAJM family gathered last Tuesday evening at the Old West Enrichment Center under heavy cloud cover. The mood inside the building, was in sharp contrast to the weather conditions—powerful, positive and definitely empowering promising—all three. Our meeting received reports from the Nominating and House Meeting committees—SMAA did submit ahead of time, a report of our “house meeting” held as part of the Eucharist last Sunday. We received by acclamation, two new member congregations—Holy Comforter Episcopal Church and Grace Mission—so we have added more voices to the cause of justice here in our city and surrounding areas.

Then it was time for reports from our subcommittees:-

1. Gun Violence
2. Affordable Housing
3. Hunger & Food Insecurity

The Rev. A.J Mealor, reported in place of Elder Connel Leonard, that CAJM remains engaged with the both the TPD and the Sheriff's Office, as they pursue a “violence interruption program”. AJ also made mention of the Men & Boys program/initiative that brings together troubled youth (both male & female), to receive counsel and advice from concerned persons in our community.

Bob Deyle (co-chair of the Affordable Housing Committee), more or less re-iterated much of what I reported last Sunday, but assured the gathering that the committee remains fully engaged with both the City and County Commissioners.

Susan Robinson (Holy Comforter), spoke of our continuing concern for those who live in “food deserts” in our city, and the fact that beneficiaries of the SNAP program could soon lose expected payments! She mentioned in passing the increased traffic at places such as Grace Mission, with many seeking to be fed. She alluded also to Second Harvest and other “partners agencies” that are seeking to help, such, as Griffin Heights Grocery and other groups coming on board soon.

Perhaps the most intense moment of our gathering came as we listened to three (3) testimonies (i) Gun Violence, from a F.S.U. attendee, (ii) immigration from a Hispanic sister and Mental Health/Homelessness (person from Grace Mission).

Byran Stringer, our energetic Executive Director, will soon declare the issues to be researched, before they are presented to the groups who will do their usual research and investigation.
