

#### FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

# Remembering those who Served/Lest we Forget

On Tuesday November 11<sup>th</sup>, we shall pause as a nation and honor the Veterans of our armed forces, and also those were killed in the various wars we have fought. This observance began in 1919 on the first anniversary of the 1918 armistice that ended World War I. It was later commemorated in 1921 with the burial of an unknown soldier from World War I at Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia. We are not alone in this observance as other countries such as Italy and Portugal continue to conduct similar ceremonies.

November 11<sup>th</sup> became an official national holiday in the United States in 1938. In 1954, the name was changed to Veterans Day to Honor those who had served in all of our wars. Ceremonies are therefore held each year at the Tomb of the Unknowns, and floral tributes are usually placed on the graves of service men and women across the country. It has become the practice to have naturalization ceremonies also for those becoming citizens of our nation. In Britian, Canada, Australia and France, ceremonies are held to honor the veterans of World Wars I & II. Indeed, in Britain (UK), the second Sunday of November is observed as Remembrance Sunday, and in Canada, November 11<sup>th</sup> is observed as Remembrance Day. Another historical note, in Britian and Commonwealth countries and some countries in Europe, it has become common place, to observe two minutes of silence at 11:00 a.m. that day, the time and date of the World War I armistice in 1918. In the aforementioned countries, poppies are sold and worn on lapels as a way of remembering the ultimate price many paid with their lives.
