

## FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

### **Holy Innocents Day**

Today, we are celebrating as a church, Holy Innocents Day. According to the account we have in Matthew's gospel (2:16-18), Herod the Great, ordered all children 2 years and younger (boys) to be massacred! This was an attempt to destroy the Infant Jesus. After being told by the Wise Men that they had come from afar to find the Christ child, Herod initially gave the impression that he wanted to pay tribute as well. These astrologers were warned of Herod's ill intent to destroy the child, and instead of returning to his palace, returned to their homes another way. This slaughter was a revenge killing, as we would say today – countless infants were slaughtered in vain, as Joseph and Mary fled to Egypt under the cover of darkness, taking the child Jesus with them.

The death of these "innocents" is always commemorated on December 28<sup>th</sup>. Until 1960, if the observance fell on a weekday, the clergy celebrated in purple vestments, but now the privilege of ""martyrs" is afforded to those innocents, and as such, red vestments are utilized instead.

I am sure that we can think of the many "innocents" who continue to die unnecessarily in our world, because of wars and the genocides that continue to be perpetrated against the little ones among us. Indeed, children are the first victims of war – the statistics from the Palestinian and Israeli conflict show how it resulted in the deaths of countless children – and so has the war between Ukraine and Russia. Let us not forget either the ethnic cleansing that has taken place in Africa and Asia.

A disturbing recent report by an international journalist, detailed how six hundred thousand died in Africa, when USAID closed their offices on the continent – of those, 400,000 were children who either starved to death, or were not able to receive medication that could have spared many of those lives. At times like these, I often think of the words of Jesus "suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not, for of such is the kingdom of heaven" Children have a special place in God's heart and He expects us to protect them and not destroy their innocence.

So today as we celebrate the Holy Innocents, let's pray that God's children everywhere, those of our own communities and country, and those in far off countries, remain protected from all evil.
